M. Carolyn Steele: Raised and educated in Tulsa, Oklahoma, Carolyn enjoyed a career in journalism and commercial art before retiring to pursue a love of writing and genealogy. She has short stories published in eighteen anthologies, was recently the featured author in Writer's Monthly e-magazine, and has won numerous awards, including several crème de la cremes, as well as being nominated for a Pushcart Prize. Her writings reflect a childhood steeped in Civil War history and Indian lore. Carolyn's two historical novels, *Spirit of the Crow* and *Outrun the bullets*, are available in paperback and e-book. Combining her knowledge of storytelling and genealogy, Carolyn presents a variety of
